A true leadership story.

Lila Poonawalla was a mechanical engineer, considered herself a normal worker. Her company announced that all workers will soon lose their jobs as they lack a huge amount of turnover. If I remember it correctly: 100 million Indian Rupee.

One morning she woke up and had an idea how to solve it. She went to management and shared her idea. The management said something like "We can't do this, if you want to do it, do it on your own!" in a rather harsh tone and send her away, waving the back of their hands that she should leave now. Being Lila, being brought up to not give up, being bold, she went straight where all gathered for lunch. She stood on one table — asked for silence and explained her idea and that she is 100% committed to save the company and all jobs — even of the management, and if they would follow her. They did. She succeeded and drove the last truck to the customer closing the 100 Million Rupee promise she gave. But she did not drive in front of the truck but on the back with her co-workers.

She became a legend and heroin in India and abroad, being awarded by the Swedish King. But visiting her every time I could, talking to her with more time and getting to know her better and better — her biggest award is to see the development of the girls of her foundation "Lila
