Artist Statement & Philosophy

I began studying medicine in 2015 and graduated in 2022, but already during my studies I felt an inner pull toward art. In 2020, while still working through my final medical years, I picked up painting for the first time. What began as a search for meaning quickly became a **calling**. Balancing two worlds — the discipline of medical training and the freedom of artistic creation — shaped both my work and my philosophy. In 2022, after finishing my studies, I **committed** fully to art. For me, that decision was not just a career change but a living act of art itself: an expression of **authenticity**, **courage**, and **transformation**.

My background in medicine and psychology continues to inform my paintings. It gave me insight into human resilience, identity, and fragility — themes that now appear on canvas. I believe art is not only a luxury, but a **truth**: a way of revealing what life is really about, in its fractures and in its **wholeness**. My work seeks to capture this paradox — that we are never unbroken, but it is precisely in our **fragmentation** that we find **meaning**.

ABOUT THE ARTIST

Dr. Daniel Josef Maier (*1995) is a visual artist whose path began not in an **art academy**, but in **medicine**. During his medical studies, he discovered that his true vocation was not being a doctor, but the **creative force of art**. Out of a moment of inner emptiness grew a practice that connects **discipline**, **connection**, and profound **human insight** with **artistic expression**.

Since 2020, when Maier started with art, Maier has been developing his work autonomously – drawing, painting, and exhibiting with an uncompromising commitment to depth, authenticity, and independence. His art does not circle around the artist himself, but opens a space of responsibility, communication, and influence. Each piece invites viewers to look deeper, to question truths, and to dream beyond the limits of the ordinary.

In recent years, his works have been shown in **New York**, **Munich**, and other international cities. With upcoming exhibitions in **Barcelona** (MEAM), **Paris** (Carrousel du Louvre), **Florence** (Biennale), and **Miami** (Art Miami), Maier positions himself firmly within the **international collectors' scene**. More than 100 of his works have already entered significant private collections.

He is currently represented by Mido Galeria (Colombia), Galerie Berggasse 29 (Vienna), Artio Gallery (Toronto), and Gallery Steiner (Vienna). For collectors, he offers unique and strictly limited works – each with a certificate of authenticity, transparent provenance, and lasting value. Every painting is more than an object: it is a companion for life.

Career Trajectory

Maier only began painting in 2020, with his first exhibition in 2021. Since then, he has developed rapidly into a mid-career artist with an international profile. He sold over 100 works to private collectors and companies, self-marketing his art and building his career without permanent representation.

I EXPRESSIVE STREAMS

In Expressive Streams, painting becomes current, surge, and eruption. Each work channels the raw intensity of abstract expressionism into a visual torrent, where colors collide, fracture, and recombine into something larger than form.

The palette is deliberate yet untamed: radiant oranges ignite against the cool depths of blue, with red streaks pushing forward like sudden pulses of emotion. Black and white accents cut through this storm, like traces of logic attempting to impose order on an otherwise uncontainable field.

Lines twist into chaotic networks, while broad swathes of color pour across the canvas in rhythms that feel simultaneously impulsive and inevitable. These streams of paint are not simply gestures — they are conduits of thought, fragments of memory, surges of will.

The series does not offer serenity. It offers intensity. It exists in the electric tension between control and dissolution, inviting viewers to confront their own inner turbulence — to see in the chaos not disarray, but possibility.

RESILIENCE



This work is a visual map of persistence. Sharp black lines cut across layers of blue, white, and ochre, like scars and fractures that refuse to fade. Yet every mark carries with it not only tension, but also strength — proof of endurance. The surface feels both chaotic and deliberate, a dialogue between collapse and reconstruction.

The blues embody depth and renewal, while the warmer tones suggest the hidden energy that drives us forward. The drips and scratches are not imperfections, but testimonies of survival — each trace a story of having been tested and still standing.
















CLASSICAL DISRUPTION

he series Classical Disruption confronts the tension between past and present. Each painting begins with a serene, classical still life or landscape — visual relics of a world that once felt timeless. Onto these canvases, bold neon splashes, drips, and modern interventions are layered, breaking the illusion of harmony and forcing the past into dialogue with the present.


The dripping paint becomes a metaphor for the overflow of modernity into tradition: consumerism, fast food, industrialization, and environmental decline stain once-idyllic scenes. By disturbing the order of inherited imagery, Classical Disruption raises questions of sustainability, consumption, and our estrangement from the sources of what nourishes us.

This is not destruction, but transformation. The clash of expressive neon pinks and oranges with muted historical tones challenges viewers to reflect: What do we carry forward from tradition? What is lost in the noise of progress? And where, in the chaos, lies the chance for renewal?

Blumenkind takes the innocence of a classical floral still life and breaks it open with contemporary irony. From the lower corner emerges a childlike figure, rendered in black and white, holding out a bouquet with arms outstretched — as if trying to offer purity back to a world already soaked in neon disruption. The surrounding splash of pink and orange paint surges like a wave, flooding the calm bouquet with unruly energy.

This work embodies the tension between innocence and intrusion, between the fragile beauty of nature and the noisy spectacle of modernity. The bouquet, once a timeless symbol of devotion and harmony, is reframed: is it a gift, a protest, or an act of resistance?

Blumenkind asks the viewer to confront the contradictions of our time: the longing for purity in a culture oversaturated with consumption and chaos. It suggests that innocence survives — not untouched, but transformed.

FAST FOOD



A pastoral harvest scene, once tranquil, now collides with absurd modernity. Horses pull hay across golden fields, yet in the margins, a cow is abducted by a UFO while another floats away, tethered to a balloon. Neon pink splashes and acidic drips slash across the surface, breaking the illusion of timeless rural peace.

The work plays with the grotesque humor of consumption — animals that once symbolized nourishment and labor are transformed into surreal commodities. A cow becomes both victim and parody, a symbol for how detached we've grown from the origins of what we eat.



PRIMATES OF ART

volution of who we are and what we do in the jungle of life. In the series Primates of Art, irony, vitality, and seriousness merge into a homage to the human condition in all its roles. Each primate carries the masks we wear in the social jungle: from the Expert to the Raver, the Gangster, the Player, the Bartender, the King, the Calm One, the Surgeon, to the Pensioner or the Instigator.

The choice of primates is deliberate: they mirror our evolutionary heritage while the bright colors and ironic embodiments highlight the humor and absurdity of our self-performances. Archetypical role models emerge that feel both familiar and alien.

Each work is a unique piece – as incomparable as life itself. The series invites us to question our own roleplay: Where are we free, where are we trapped? Where do we laugh at ourselves – and where does the mirror begin to sting?

With Primates of Art, Daniel Josef Maier celebrates the multiplicity of human existence: colorful, expressive, critical, and yet full of lightness.

THE EXPERT



The Expert embodies our fascination with authority and knowledge — and the comedy that lies within it. Dressed in a lab coat, holding a flask, and roaring with laughter, this figure exaggerates the image of the all-knowing professional.

The primate's wide-open mouth mocks the seriousness with which we often approach expertise. It reminds us that knowledge, while essential, can also become performance — a mask worn as much for recognition as for truth. The splashes of neon color reinforce the playful chaos around the figure, suggesting that certainty is never as stable as it looks.

In this work, irony and respect collide: a critique of blind trust in authority, and at the same time, a celebration of curiosity and discovery. The Expert asks us to laugh at our roles without dismissing their importance.



THE GANGSTER



The Gangster is a portrait of power dressed in fear and illusion. Half-hidden behind cap and mask, the primate's piercing eye becomes the focal point: a gaze that reveals both control and vulnerability. The chaotic explosion of colors around the figure mirrors the tension between façade and truth.

This work plays with the archetype of dominance and intimidation. The mask is both protection and performance — a reminder that much of what we call strength is staged, an act to cover fragility. Bright strokes of neon cut through the darker tones, hinting at the instability beneath the tough exterior.

The Gangster challenges the viewer to see beyond the mask, to recognize that rawness and fear often hide behind bravado. It is as much a satire of constructed power as it is a reflection on the human need for roles and armor.

THE PENSIONER



The Pensioner captures the quiet dignity of a life lived and the bittersweet stillness that follows. Reclining in an armchair, drink in hand, the gorilla gazes forward with an expression that is both calm and contemplative. Around him, neon splashes of pink, yellow, and blue still pulse with energy — reminders of a world in motion that he now watches rather than chases.

This work reflects on age, time, and the roles we leave behind. It is not resignation, but acceptance: a recognition that evolution is not only about striving forward, but also about learning to rest. The Pensioner becomes a symbol of endurance, wisdom, and the right to simply be—a counterpoint to the constant performance of younger roles.

The Pensioner asks the viewer to consider their own relationship with time, achievement, and legacy. In his stillness lies a different kind of power: the freedom to slow down.

The Player embodies charisma, risk, and the allure of the game. Every detail suggests tension: the thrill of winning, the danger of losing, and the mask of control worn in between.


This work explores the archetype of performance — not only in casinos or games of chance, but in life itself. We all become "players" at times, navigating roles, strategies, and risks in the social jungle. The gorilla's intense expression mirrors the weight of decisions and the fascination with uncertainty.

The vibrant splashes surrounding him echo the unpredictability of life: messy, bold, and never fully within our control. The Player reminds us that while luck is fleeting, the courage to sit at the table is itself an act of power.

THE SURGEON



The Surgeon is precision personified. Masked and dressed in green scrubs, the primate leans over the canvas space as if it were an operating table. His eyes, intense and unflinching, are the only part of his face revealed — a sharp contrast to the neon splashes of pink and orange that surround him.

This work captures the archetype of control, responsibility, and the razor's edge between success and failure. Surgery here becomes a metaphor: each of us, in our roles, cuts, stitches, and reshapes the fabric of our lives. The primate's calm focus highlights the burden of such decisions, while the chaotic colors suggest that even precision is never free from risk and disorder.

The Surgeon asks us to reflect on the weight of responsibility. It is a portrait of discipline and fragility — a reminder that even mastery exists within uncertainty.

The King radiates authority, presence, and unapologetic grandeur. This work explores the archetype of leadership as performance. The bright, chaotic background contrasts with the controlled stillness of the figure, suggesting that power is less about chaos itself and more about the ability to remain untouched by it. Yet irony lingers: a primate crowned as king exposes the absurdity of human hierarchies, hinting at how fragile authority truly is.

The King invites us to question the roles of dominance and reverence. Is leadership genuine strength, or simply the confidence to wear the crown convincingly?



These images are mirrors. Not to look at oneself - but to recognize oneself.



Beyond Sound and Smoke is a visual mantra for reconnection. The violet and red swirls evoke mental overwhelm. But the colors transform – through orange into brightness, finally arriving at a calm, blue center.

The closed eyes symbolize surrender. The courage to let go. The path back – out of the mind, into the self. This piece does not invite thinking. It invites feeling. And that is where its power lies.

AR experience: The streams of color begin to flow, the fog lifts. Clarity becomes visible – from the inside out.

BREAKTHROUGH – THE BIRTH OF THE NEW SELF

Breakthrough is not loud, not dramatic – and that's exactly what makes it so powerful. This work captures the moment when the new no longer waits, but enters. The fractured surface – like glass, like skin, like an old reality – reveals a face that does not doubt.

The eyes are clear, the lips slightly parted, ready. What happens here is not a struggle, but a decision: I allow my true self to be seen.

This fracture is not damage. It is a sign of maturity. Breakthrough reminds us: it doesn't take force to break through boundaries. Only clarity. And the courage to be present.

What follows is not a new self. But the first real one.

| HOLOTROPIC INSIGHTS

ome images do not come from the mind. They rise. Like breath from the depths. This series was not planned. It emerged — unasked, unforced — during and after a holotropic retreat with Dr. Sylvester Walch. These paintings are not a reflection, not a postscript. They are a continuation. The breathing did not end with the session; it spilled into color, line, and rhythm.

The works carry the traces of dissolution, vision, and return. They are less about painting something than about allowing something to paint itself. They exist in the fragile space where control is lost, and deeper truths surface. With these works I found my identity as an artist and made them visible. This changed the process of how I create tremendously. Paintings in this style are the blueprints of my upcoming works.

PREPARATION



The first step is not a step outward. But inward.

Preparation reveals that state of suspension where something begins before it has shape. A longing. An inner call.

The colors vibrate like an announcement — yellow, pink, and violet colliding without fully merging. Black lines trace boundaries that give a fragile sense of structure, yet they are constantly interrupted by the movement underneath.



BEYOND THE BOXES

he collection Beyond the Boxes began with the familiar four-color personality test – red for power, blue for logic, green for kindness, yellow for enthusiasm. Systems like these promise clarity, but what they truly reveal is our deep desire to classify, to simplify, to put people into boxes.

In these works, the archetypes come alive as half-human, half-animal characters: striking, humorous, yet unsettling. They remind us how easily we wear masks, how quickly society labels us.

But the deeper truth is this: humans cannot be reduced to a single color or role. We are not fixed types, but shifting constellations of qualities. We can be fierce and gentle, logical and chaotic, consistent and contradictory – sometimes in the very same moment. Beyond the Boxes is a celebration of this complexity. It challenges the viewer to question the labels they have accepted, and to embrace the freedom that comes with breaking out of them.



THE WEIGHT OF LOGIC



The Weight of Logic portrays the archetype of the rational mind – sharp, precise, uncompromising. Numbers, formulas, and systems promise security; they give us the illusion that everything can be explained, ordered, calculated. Yet this painting asks: what is lost when we try to live only by logic?

The owl-faced figure, with calculator and book in hand, embodies clarity and structure – but also the heaviness of reduction. Life is more than equations. Humans are not made to fit into formulas.

This work challenges the viewer to recognize the value of intellect without being consumed by it. True wisdom is not the absence of feeling, but the balance of mind and heart.

THE GENTLE MASK

The elephant figure reminds us that compassion is powerful, but it cannot mean self-erasure. True kindness begins where self-respect is not sacrificed. Humans are not made to fit into roles of endless giving.

This work challenges the viewer to value kindness as strength, not submission. To practice empathy without losing one's own boundaries.

ECHOES OF AUTHORITY



Echoes of Authority portrays the performance of power. With suit and tie, the figure projects control and status — an image crafted to impress. Yet beneath the polished surface, the work asks: how much of what we call leadership is true strength, and how much is simply imitation?

Hints of sheep and ape weave through the metaphor: sheep as the symbol of blind following, ape as mimicry without substance. Authority, without authenticity, risks becoming nothing more than an echo—loud, but hollow.

This work challenges the viewer to question not only those who lead, but also the urge to follow or to copy. Power that endures is not based on dominance, but on truth, integrity, and the ability to inspire without masks.

The lion archetype shows us that strength is real only when it is rooted in integrity, not fear. Leadership without humility becomes a mask — shiny on the surface, hollow at its core. Humans are not made to fit into hierarchies alone; we are meant to rise by lifting others.


This work challenges the viewer to rethink what power means: not domination, but presence. Not control, but responsibility.

The parrot archetype reminds us that repetition is not expression, and being loud is not the same as being true. Humans are not made to live as echoes of others' expectations — we are more than applause, more than spectacle.

This work invites the viewer to reclaim joy not as a mask, but as authentic fire. To laugh, speak, and shine — not because the world demands it, but because it is real.

VOICES ON FIRE

oices on Fire began as an experiment, a sketchbook brought to life on cardboard. Four square works, raw and immediate, each carrying a declaration: Feel it. Do it. Right or Wrong, I'm in. Still Loud, Still True. Fell in Love. With a Feeling.

These pieces are not the final statement, but the ignition. They are the draft of a larger vision — a precollection that strips empowerment down to its essence before it expands into a greater body of work. The use of cardboard underlines this intention: unpolished, uncompromising, closer to a note scribbled in urgency than to a neatly bound book.

Here, commitment is everything. To act, to speak, to remain true, to love — not halfway, not conditionally, but with full presence.

For collectors, this precollection is both rare and symbolic: a glimpse into the genesis of a larger series, and the chance to own the raw beginnings of a vision that will grow.

he collection Totem Truths translates ancient archetypes into contemporary form. Each canvas embodies a totem – Wolf, Bull, Raven, and Eagle – as a visual force carrying values that shape human growth: loyalty, bravery, wisdom, and intuition.

Created in oil and acrylics, refined with 24-karat gold, the works combine raw energy with timeless elegance. Gold here is not embellishment; it is a mark of permanence – the incorruptible truth that cuts through distraction.

Taken together, the four paintings form a compass. The Wolf stands for loyalty and belonging. The Bull embodies bravery, the power to break through barriers. The Raven reveals wisdom, a voice of clarity and transformation. The Eagle represents intuition, vision, and the courage to rise above fear.
